U.S. Border Crisis Reaches Far from the Border

The migrant crisis in New York City and other cities far from the Southern border of the United States has become acute. Meanwhile, the political crisis of illegal border crossings seems as intractable as ever with tensions rising.

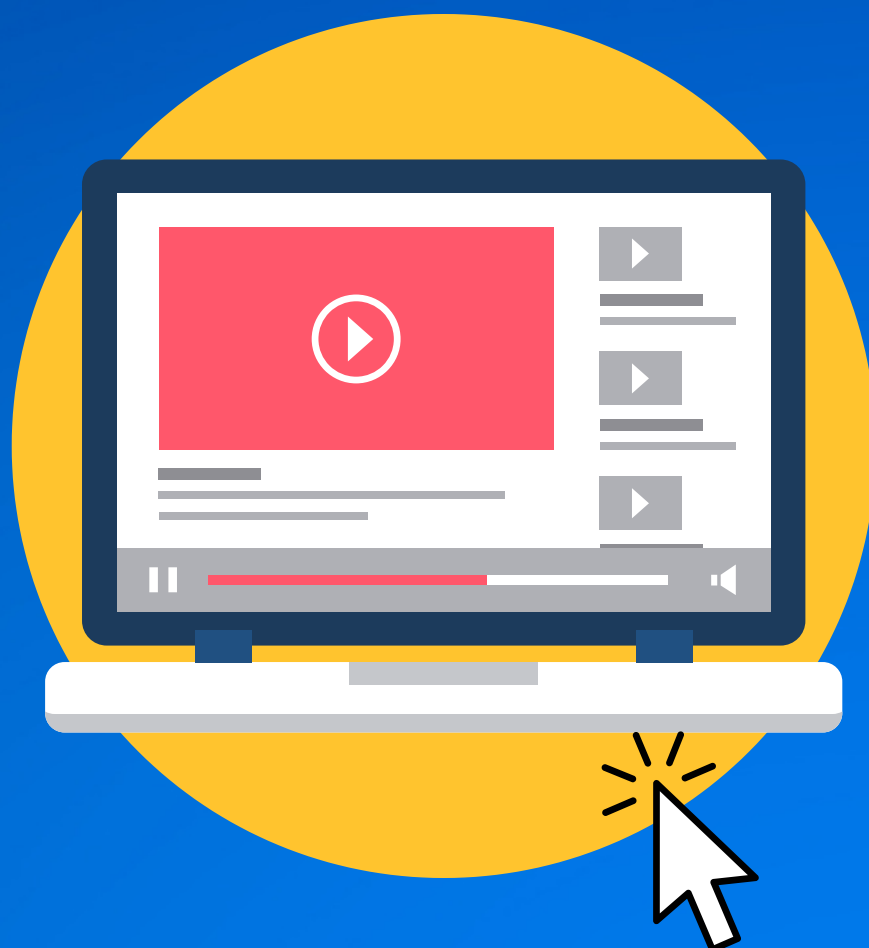
New York City Mayor Eric Adams has said on multiple occasions that the migrant crisis would destroy the city. On 5 February, he joined a police raid of a Bronx home of Victor Parra, who is believed to be behind a rash of thefts in the city. Police said they think the man entered the country from Venezuela a year ago, and he was allegedly recruiting more recent migrants to snatch cell phones and bags from people as they speed past on mopeds or scooters. Officials say more than 60 such incidents have been reported in the last few days.

Fast Facts: 4 Common Cyberattacks Hitting Healthcare

Cyberattacks on healthcare organizations aren't just an inconvenience—they also impact patients' safety and care. More than 80 percent of healthcare providers had at least one cyberattack between March 2022 and March 2023, according to a Proofpoint and Ponemon Institute survey.

Among healthcare organizations targeted by cyberattacks, the average total cost of the most expensive incident was \$4.9 million, and the costlier attacks resulted in an average of \$1.3 million in disruption to normal healthcare operations.

Global Ransomware Payments Reached \$1.1B in 2023

Ransomware payments are back with a vengeance. After a notable decrease in payments in 2022 (from \$983 million to \$567 million), cryptocurrency tracing firm Chainalysis found that ransomware attackers received \$1.1 billion from their victims in 2023—the highest number ever observed.

“Although 2022 saw a decline in ransomware payment volume, the overall trend line from 2019 to 2023 indicates that ransomware is an escalating problem,” a [Chainalysis report](#) said. “Keep in mind that this number does not capture the economic impact of productivity loss and repair costs associated with attacks. This is evident in cases like the [ALPHV-BlackCat](#) and [Scattered Spider’s](#) bold targeting of [MGM resorts](#). While MGM did not pay the ransom, it estimates damages cost the business over \$100 million.”

Congratulations to our Chapter Mentorship Chair, Mike Ortiz of P4 Companies, on being named the BOMA Chicago 2024 Security Professional of the Year!

The Associate Protection Professional (APP) designation provides the first "rung" on the security professional's career ladder. It is for those with 1 or more years of compensated security experience and measures the professional's knowledge of security

fundamentals, business operations, risk management, and response management.

The Professional Certified Investigator (PCI) certification provides demonstrable proof of an individual's knowledge and experience in case management, evidence collection, and preparation of reports and testimony to substantiate findings. ASIS Chicago Chapter 2024 Study Group Details

Security Professionals:

Registration begins February 5th for our 2024 ASIS Chicago CPP Study Group. The Study Group starts Saturday, 03/02/2024 and runs eight weeks, and ends with the last session on Saturday, 4/20/2024.

The Study Group is 8 weekly sessions via ASIS Chicago's Zoom Link. Sessions are Saturday mornings from 9am to 10:30am.

The CPP Study Group is coordinated and hosted by ASIS Chicago. Below is a description of the ASIS Study Group; and why it's a great opportunity to help you prep for and pass your ASIS exam.

Intended Audience:

Security professionals planning to take their ASIS CPP or other certification examination within the next 3-6 months.

ASIS Chicago Study Group (SG) Overview:

- This study group method is a simple and effective exam preparation method.
- Our SG provides attendees the opportunity to participate in an informal and practical learning experience.
- The SG is effective because attendees interact with like-minded security professionals, who possess ASIS exam prep experience, as well as security-related experience, knowledge, and expertise.
- Attendees learn how to use the ASIS Protection of Assets (POA) Manual, Standards and Guidelines, and other source materials to prepare for the rigorous, stressful, and challenging ASIS examination.
- Attendees discover new and effective study methods CPP or other credential holders have used to prep for and pass their exams.
- Attendees also learn which methods are less effective for passing the CPP and/or other ASIS exams.



ASIS Chicago Chapter 2024 Study Group Details Continued

Study Group Method:

- Attendees are assigned a security-related or CPP Domain topic to present during the SG.
- Attendees create and present a 15 minute Powerpoint Presentation (PPT) summary of their assigned topic to fellow attendees.
- Attendees also compose 20 questions and answers from their assigned topic to share with other attendees. (Consider this a "potluck" version of building a test Q&A bank.)
- At the conclusion of the SG, all attendee created Q&As are pooled together into a large practice examination. The practice exam and other SG tools are given to all attendees to help them prepare for their ASIS Exam Day.

Anticipated Outcome/Benefits:

- Participating in the SG is like "pre-season football, baseball, or hockey" for Exam takers. For many it's been a while since they prepped for a serious exam. The SG gradually improves your study habits, concentration skills, and exam-taking techniques.
- Meet and network with others who have passed (and failed) their ASIS exam; allowing you to learn from their experiences.
- ASIS exams are challenging and intense. Few are able to pass without serious exam day preparation.
- ASIS Exam Prep is like prepping to run a marathon. For most runners, it takes six months of consistent prep to run 26 miles and live-- after crossing the finish line.
- This SG offers a similar benefit for those intending to take their exam.
- Participating in a SG helps you identify your strong and weak subject matter areas and exam prep methods.
- Participating in the SG gradually and consistently improves your self confidence.
- Taking SG practice quizzes gives you instant feedback on your exam prep progress and prep methods. Example: if your practice quiz scores and content retention are not improving, you may need to change exam day prep methods.

Anticipated Outcome/Benefits Continued:

- Also, taking "real-world" practice quizzes before Exam Day, reduces Exam Day anxiety. Think of your practice exams as "dress rehearsals" for ASIS Exam Day.
- Attendees who complete their SG assignments receive copies of all SG materials (power points, practice questions and answers, tips, etc.).
- Attendees who complete their SG assignments also are eligible to receive ASIS Exam Day prep gifts donated by ASIS Chicago. *Some gifts/awards are listed below.
- Attendees also receive an ASIS Certificate of Completion equal to 13 CPEs.

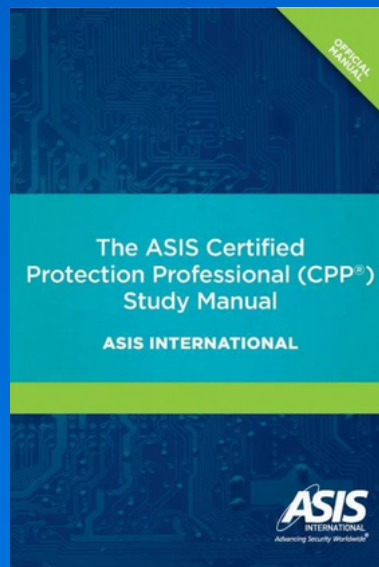
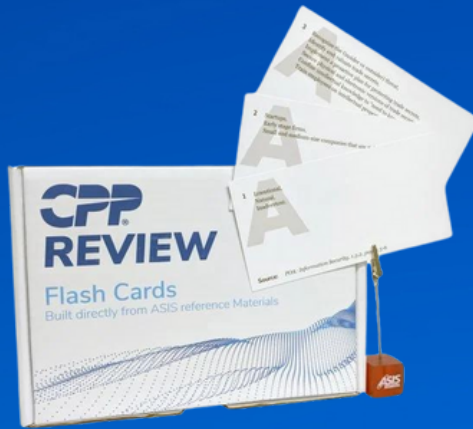
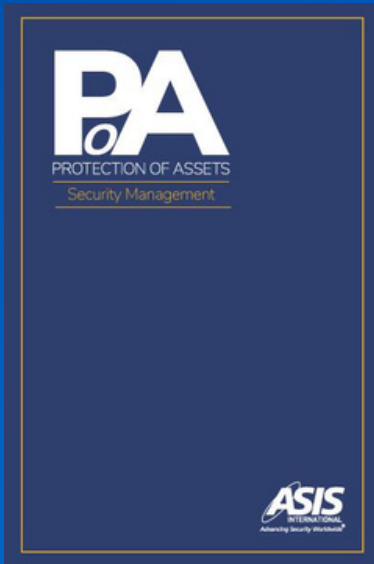

Do You Feel Overwhelmed by the Emails Being Sent From ASIS?

We have heard from several Chicago members that they feel inundated and overwhelmed with emails from the Chapter. We as a Board and Chairs, do our best to keep our Chapter communications to a minimum. We send out one to two announcements per week for our upcoming events and increase the frequency the week of so that those whose schedules free up at the last minute can attend.

As we investigated this issue further, we believe that perhaps the root of the “too many emails from ASIS” are from International, specifically, the Community Connections emails. Based on your selected preferences in your International profile of interests/expertise, International will then send those applicable Community emails. Those notifications can be modified by going into your ASIS International profile and changing your ASIS Connected Community Settings and/or your email & communication preferences as follows:

Step 1: After logging into ASIS International, click on My Information, select My Account, and then in the ASIS Links box to the right – My Communication Preferences.

Step 2: After making and saving changes scroll to the bottom of the page and click on ASIS Connected Community. Click on My Connections to see which ASIS Communities you are enrolled in and determine how often you want to receive them – daily or weekly. Make your changes and then hit save (also check to see who you are following).

Step 3: Move to the My Community Tab and select Email Preferences and verify or change your preferences and hit save. In this same tab, select Communication Notifications and do the same.

Change In From Email Address re: Meeting Announcements From Our Chapter Webmaster

Below is an article from StarChapter, our website service and the service we use to send out mass emails to our Chapter members and nonmembers explaining a change in the From Address from mass emails coming from our Chapter. In the past the announcements about our meetings and events used to come from webmaster@asischicago.net. The new email address being used is now: postmaster@mg.asischicago.net. Please make sure that you check your junk and spam folders in case these emails are going there and unblock that new postmaster@mg.asischicago.net. Thanks.



StarChapter made some updates to our mass emailing features to comply with new guidelines required by Google and Yahoo. This change in From Address is in place to ensure to those providers that mass emails coming from your organization are authentic, and not spam. It may take some time for all email providers to adapt based on those guidelines, as all bulk email tools are experiencing an increase in delivery issues immediately following these new requirements. This issue should improve as email providers adapt to the new policies.

Moving forward, all mass email sent through your StarChapter system will be from postmaster@mg.yourdomain.ext. Yourdomain.ext will be replaced with your organization's domain name. You will still have the ability to add a unique reply-to email address or sender name to your message when setting up your email campaigns.

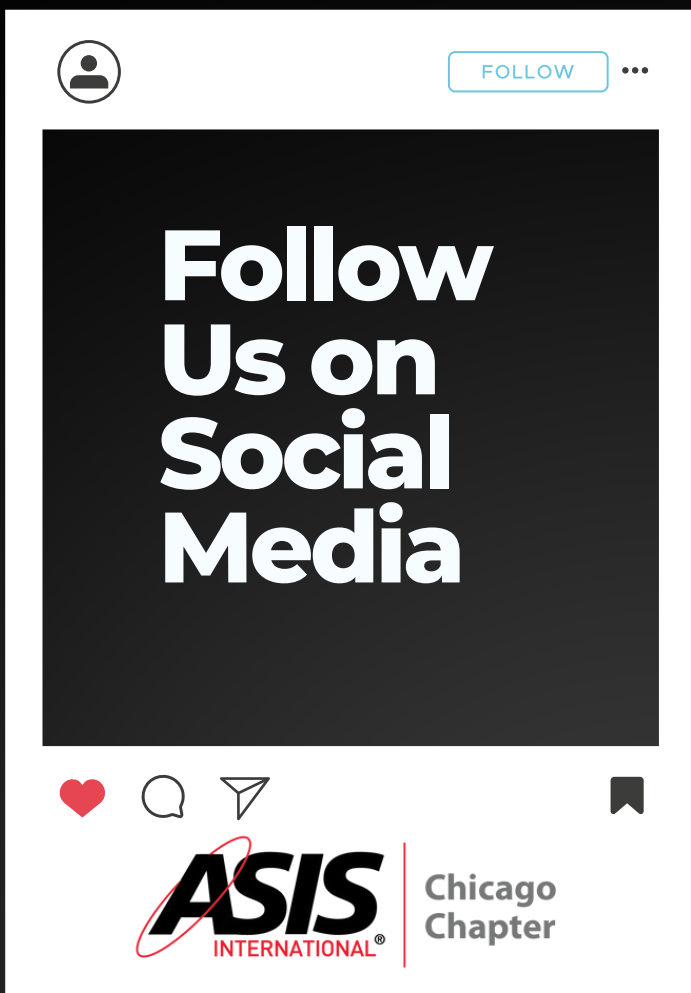
