As announced recently at our last Chapter meeting and in an email announcement, our web platform StarChapter required the Board to move to a new payment method called StarChapter Pay. This move means that we can no longer use PayPal as a method of payment for members/nonmembers and guests to pay local dues and any registration fees, respectively, when we go back to in-person meetings and events. The Board was rather disappointed to learn that StarChapter was requiring this change. However, since this new payment method integrates the member, nonmember/guest information in our system, it ended up making sense to make the switch. I have personally used the system upon its roll out and I can assure all of you, that it is a safe and secure payment method (the url link does contain https), it is easier to use than PayPal and within minutes after making your payment you receive two emails. The first email is your payment receipt which prints out in an easier to read format and nothing is “out of whack” as I would call it AND a second email which confirms your registration. So please, do not hesitate or be afraid of using it going forward.

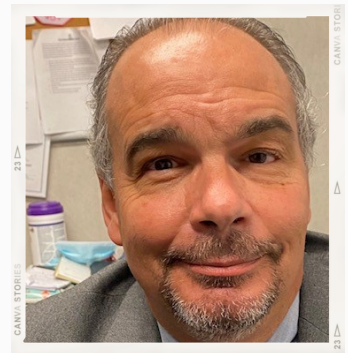
