Mr. Kinard has been in law enforcement, corporate security, and in the investigative field for more than 26 years. He is currently employed full time with the Chicago Police Department. Mr. Kinard is a graduate of the University of Illinois-Chicago with a Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice, is a licensed Illinois Private Investigator and is currently instructor certified in firearms, personal protection, defensive tactics, and investigations. Mr. Kinard was a certified federal instructor of airport security under the Department of Homeland Security, he has taught OSHA compliant safety and emergency care and holds various training and instructor certificates.

Mr. Kinard's career began with his service in the U.S. Army Reserve, including an ROTC Commission, grew through experience as the owner of a private security and investigative services company, and continued as Director of Training for a Fortune 500 security company. He contracted with Lockheed-Martin Specialized Security Division to facilitate the training and transition of federal airport security personnel for the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Transportation Security Administration.

Mr. Kinard accepted a criminal justice research fellowship with the National Council on Crime & Delinquency, Washington D.C. He participated in several specialized training programs including one with the Special Agents of the U.S. Treasury Department as a Criminal Investigator. Mr. Kinard established Menelek Investigation Corporation in Ft. Lauderdale Florida. The agency was full service, specializing in insurance fraud, criminal and civil investigative casework.

As Director of Security and Director of Training and Development for two Chicago agencies, he developed training curriculum, workshops and seminars, conducted professional security officer management training and employee career development courses. Mr. Kinard contracted with the US Department of Defense as a Anti-Terrorism Force Protection Officer and Manager to provide security support for the US Army Area Support Group Kuwait. He is also a Security Deputy Program Manager for the US Army Intelligence and Security Command.

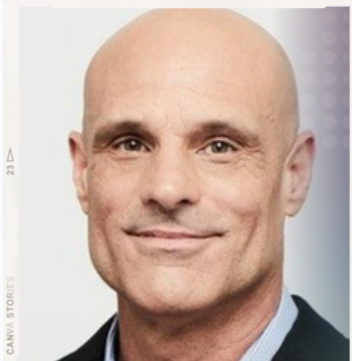

Pierre has had years of experience within the physical and cyber security arena and has been involved in developing security governance programs and has been integral in the design of enterprise security systems.

His primary expertise is Physical, Cyber Security Governance and is an SME in video security analytics and integration. Pierre's path has taken him from the Physical security barrier industry, gate control, electronic security, managed services security, and finally cyber security arena. I had the pleasure of working as a marketing consultant and attended the most recent International Association of Campus Law Enforcement Administrators (IACLEA) annual conference and exposition in Las Vegas. There were many takeaways from breakout sessions and keynote speakers that I thought were relevant to the public safety/security industry and worth sharing with all of you.

For those of you who may not work within higher education or be unfamiliar with IACLEA, it is an association of campus police chiefs world-wide. The list of countries outside of the US is small, but growing with the arrival of Executive Director Paul Cell at the helm. Highlights from Keynote Speakers at the 2022 IACLEA Conference

Sergeant Justin Van Nest, Las Vegas Metro Police Department

It was his first day as Sergeant and the Route 91 Harvest Festival was about to come to a conclusion. He was fist bumping his officers, saying "easy money" and listening to his favorite singer Jason Aldean perform. Their department was at their most vulnerable when he heard shots fired and we all watched in silence the camera body footage that showed the chaos, confusion, and devastation from the deadliest mass shooting by a single individual in US history.



As harrowing as that experience was, Sgt. Van Nest shared lessons the Las Vegas Metro Police Department learned from that experience: the importance of multi agency response training (sharing all lesson plans, policies and procedures with other agencies), training to the new trends- open air venues, ensuring vehicles and weapons are easily accessible (they were unable to get to their vehicles, developing strong radio discipline (wasted radio traffic prevented an officer with crucial information to get through), having adequate medical supplies during large-scale events, and utilizing event apps with local hospital information (people googled nearby clinics which were closed).



Jim Moore, Sr. Advisor for Clery Act Compliance & Campus Safety Operations, US Department of Education and Frank Spano, Director of Education Security Services, Allied Universal

Two cream-colored chairs were on stage and Jim Moore and Frank Spano had a fireside chat with a room of several hundred campus police professionals. They discussed the Clery Act (which if you are unfamiliar, requires colleges and universities to report campus crime data, support victims of violence, and publicly outline the policies and procedures they have put into place to improve campus safety). Despite the campus-specific topic, the advice was spot on for all members in the field of public safety.

JESICA LOPEZ-HUSKEY

University of Chicago Public Safety/Police/Comms Safety Communications Manager



- We need to address critical issues collaboratively, especially in topics as sexual assault and mental health. We need to work from the inside out and collaborate together.
- We need to transform what we are doing to meet expectations of our community. We need transparency, engagement, positive community development and investment. If you improve wellness, you improve law and order.
- Advocate for your seat at the table, you need to be part of budget meetings that make decisions that could have adverse effects on safety.
- Colleges and universities can be the testing grounds for implementing transformative changes that can be proofs of concepts for how build a road map for K-12 schools.
- One of the most important things for those within public safety is to learn how to craft public messaging.

Paul Cell, Executive Director, IACLEA (Former Chief of Police at Montclair State University and former International Chiefs of Police Association President)

- Arrogance and self awareness rarely go hand in hand. Check your ego at the door. Don't take things personally and don't let others stop from telling you it's not okay.
- Communication has to be clear, two way and transparent. Otherwise you lose integrity.
- Adaptability is key. What worked 20 years ago doesn't work today. What got you here isn't going to take you there.
- How well do you know your team? How well do they know their roles? Do they REALLY know what their roles are? Motivate them and give them a sense of purpose.
- Recognize things will go wrong. Look for alternatives. Stop when you are done, not tired.
- You have to have the passion and vision and goal and have to take action based on your training, built from your experience. Failure to act is the worst thing you can do.
- The negative person in the department has a solid impact in your agency. Address it. When something goes wrong once it is a phenomenon, twice it's a circumstance but three times is a trend.
- Make sure to take time for you and your team to recover. Create a program addressing physical and mental well being.

Lastly, what are you doing to make yourself better? Get certified. Complacency in public safety will kill you. Prioritize partnerships. Attend conferences. And on that note...

ASIS INTERNATIONAL INVOICE CHANGES

ASIS International has made changes to the invoicing language to help distinguish between payment to **International Dues** and payment for **Chapter Dues**. OVERWHELMED BY ALL THE ASIS EMAILS?

We have heard from several Chicago members that they feel inundated and overwhelmed with emails from the Chapter. We as a Board and Chairs, do our best to keep our Chapter communications to a minimum. We send out 1-2 announcements per week for our upcoming events and increase the frequency the week of so that those whose schedules free up at the last minute can attend.

We believe that the root of the “too many emails from ASIS” are from International, specifically, the Community Connections emails. Based on your selected preferences in your International profile of interests/expertise, International will then send those applicable Community emails. However, the notifications can be modified by going into your ASIS International profile and changing your ASIS Connected Community Settings and/or your email & communication preferences as follows:

- 1** After logging into ASIS International, click on My Information, select My Account. In the ASIS Links box to the right, click on My Communication Preferences.
- 2** Scroll to the bottom of the page and click on ASIS Connected Community. Click on My Connections to see which ASIS Communities you are enrolled in and to see who you are following. Determine how often you want to receive them – daily or weekly. Make sure to save all of your changes.
- 3** Move to the My Community tab and select Email Preferences and verify or change your preferences. Click on save. In this same My Community tab, select Communication Notifications and verify or change your preferences. Make sure to save all of your changes.

Chicago's Public and Private Partnership (CP3) initiative is a result of the City of Chicago's desire to strengthen its partnership with its private sector. After listening to your needs, the CP3 consortium of city agencies developed this portal to centralize how information is gathered and disseminated. This portal serves as a single site to submit information for the Chicago Office of Emergency Management and Communications, the Chicago Fire Department, the Chicago Department of Public Health and the Chicago Police Department.

Provided information will assist First Responders in addressing an incident and will assist emergency management executives in the development of citywide response plans. Through the use of this portal, information can be updated and submitted in a timely fashion providing instantaneous access to those who need the information.

In addition, as a CP3 partner, you will have access to an array of documents providing an additional resource regarding security measures and emergency planning. All users are also included in the CP3 Mass Alert System which will provide timely situational awareness and briefs on subject matters specific to your area of interest and responsibility.

Eugene Posey, pictured in the center, our Chapter Treasurer and Social Media Chairperson provided much of the Uniformed Security Officer services at the Taste of Chicago July 8-10 in Grant Park. The "Taste" is Chicago's premiere summer/tourist event.

SAFE CHICAGO



SAFE CHICAGO is a new public safety program launched by OEMC in partnership with the Chicago Fire Department, Chicago Police Department, and Assets and Information Services.

MISSION Safe Chicago's mission is to improve the safety of municipal employees by making life-saving bleeding control equipment and training readily available in the workplace for anyone to use in the event of an emergency.

THE PROGRAM Bleeding control kits will be installed at every occupied, City-owned or leased facility and when used can bridge the gap between initial life-threatening injury and EMS arrival. For additional details, visit Chicago.gov/OEMC or stopthebleed.org



BLEEDING CONTROL KITS One wall-mounted kit is designed to treat 8 victims before EMS arrives. Each kit includes a tourniquet, combat gauze, trauma shears, gloves, blanket, marker, and an instruction manual.

Life-threatening bleeding emergencies can be the result of falls, penetrating injuries, gunshot wounds, and more. Knowing how to control bleeding from a serious injury is essential knowledge to keep you and those around you safe.

Quick Tips for Controlling Bleeding from a Limb:

1. Call 911, ensure scene safety, don PPE
2. Place tourniquet 2-3 inches above patients bleeding site
3. Tighten tourniquet until the bleeding stops
4. Mark time tourniquet was applied and stay with patient until help arrives
5. NEVER take off a tourniquet once applied

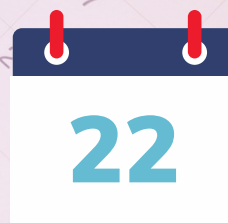
