Hello Security Professionals,

Registration opens on January 11, 2022 for our 2022 ASIS Chicago Study Group (SG2022). The Study Group begins Saturday, February 12, 2022 and ends Saturday, April 9, 2022. The Group is being hosted by ASIS Chicago via Zoom.

Below is a description of the Study Group (SG); and why it's a great opportunity to help you prep for and pass the CPP, PCI, APP and/or PSP exam.

Intended Audience: Security professionals planning to take their ASIS certification examination within the next 3-6 months.

ASIS CHICAGO STUDY GROUP OVERVIEW:

This study group (SG) method is a simple and effective exam prep technique. Our SG provides attendees the opportunity to participate in an informal and practical learning experience.

The SG is effective because attendees interact directly with like-minded individuals who possess meaningful, security-related experience, knowledge, and expertise. Attendees also learn how to use the ASIS Possession of Assets (POA) Manual, Standards and Guidelines, and other source materials to prepare for the rigorous, stressful, and challenging examinations.

Attendees discover new and effective study methods and techniques CPPs, PSPs, APPS and PCIs have used to prep for and pass their Exams. Attendees also learn which techniques are less effective for passing the Exams.

METHOD:

- Each attendee is assigned a security-related topic from the POA, and/or the Standards and Guidelines to present during the SG.
- Attendees create and present a 15 minute Powerpoint summary of their assigned topic to fellow attendees.
- Attendees also compose 20 questions and answers from their assigned topic to share with other attendees. (Consider this a "potluck" version of building a test Q&A bank.)
- All questions and answers are pooled together to create a large practice examination with Q&As from all subject matter areas.
- CPPs, PSPs, APPs, and PCIs may also attend the SG and give presentations and answer questions about their experiences prepping for, and taking their exam.

ASIS Chicago Chapter Study Group Continued

ANTICIPATED OUTCOME/BENEFITS:

Participating in the SG is like "pre-season football, baseball, or hockey" for test takers. For many it's been a while since we prepped for a serious exam. The SG gradually improves your study habits, concentration skills, and test-taking techniques.

The SG allows you to network with others who have passed (and failed) their ASIS test; allowing others to learn from their experiences. ASIS exams are challenging and intense. Few are able to pass the test without serious preparation. I equate it to running a marathon. For most runners, it takes six months of prep to run 26 miles and live-- after crossing the finish line.

This SG offers a similar benefit for those intending to take their test. Using the SG helps you identify your strong and weak areas. Participating in the SG gradually and consistently improves your test taking abilities and self confidence. Taking the practice tests gives you instant feedback on your progress and prep methods. If your practice test scores are not improving, you need to change your prep methods.

Also, the more "real-world" practice tests you take before your real exam reduces your test day anxiety. Think of your practice exams as "dress rehearsals" for ASIS Exam Day. Costs are minimal. Attendees who participate in the Study Group and complete their assigned topics receive copies of all SG materials (power points, practice questions and answers, tips, etc.). Attendees must have their 2022 ASIS, International and local Chicago Chapter dues paid. Local Chapter dues are \$20.


Assistant Regional Vice President (ARVP) ASIS International Region 2C

You're Finally Certified- Now What?

Chapter members can fall into many points along the certification continuum; attending chapter meetings as an interested guest, joining ASIS without entering a certification program (and there are many long-term members who are in this group), making the commitment to enter and participate in a study group, and finally paying the fees and enrolling to take the exam for the desired certification. This final step can involve months of work with a cohort under the guidance of an experienced and certified group leader, such as our current study group leader Paladin Jordan and in my case, Sgt. John Sellers.

When the time is right and you have paid your fees you will have a testing date at a test center and sit for your test for several hours under supervision. Other persons at the center may be taking totally unrelated tests for other professional purposes (at this writing I am uncertain as to how Covid-19 protocols have impacted the actual testing process). As I recall I received the results for the CPP test right away and they could tell me how I did with respect to the individual subject domains. If you don't pass the first time they will give you guidance about how soon before you will be permitted to re-test (fortunately I didn't need to).

What may not be completely clear to the newly certified ASIS member is what obligations you have taken on, once certified. Becoming certified is frankly, like getting a puppy. Once you get it, you have to continue to feed it. Your certification period is three years and within that three year period you are obligated to earn 60 continuing professional education (CPE) credits and report them to ASIS International by the end of your reporting period. You can pace the acquisition of your credits however you like; if you have an intense period of two – three weeks of continuing activity and then you can coast for the next two and one-half years, that's up to you. If you're lucky enough to attend GSX two or three times, you receive up to 23 CPEs for full participation each time. You also receive 4 CPEs for each year that you are in full member status with ASIS so that will be automatically entered in your record, resulting in an automatic 12 CPEs for membership for the 3 year period.

When you are within about six months of your deadline for renewal, ASIS will start sending you emailed reminders that your deadline is approaching and you need to start completing your profile and uploading documentation of your CPE status if you have not done so already. You will learn to appreciate this annoyance; as soon as you start to organize your materials you will probably find that it takes longer than you realized.



You're Finally Certified- Now What? Continued...

A lot can happen in three years in terms of our personal records; moving, job changes, coffee spills, computer changes (not to mention the unplanned computer system crash which contained all of your records and you have to bribe your office tech Jedi with Starbucks cards to recover your files onto a remote hard drive). Also not to mention issues like Pandemics and being locked out of your workplace which may have contained some of your activity files. In three years it's also amazing how you can forget where you saved your documentation if you are involved with multiple organizations and have to search through files you may not have titled correctly or consistently. Don't kid yourself – it won't all be on the cloud.

ASIS makes this process easier for you – IF you have the discipline to do it early on in the three year period and you do it faithfully and correctly. ASIS provides detailed guidance on their website in the 40-page PDF document, ASIS International Board Recertification (asonline.org/certification/recertification) download and preferably, print the guide. This guide was revised in April 2021 and replaces all previous guides.

Each of the four certifications has a different number of domains:

APP (Associate Protection Professional) four domains.


CPP (Certified Protection Professional) seven domains.

PCI (Professional Certified Investigator) three domains.

PSP (Physical Security Professional) three domains.

Most often, certified members will be attending or participating in meetings, seminars, webinars or online activities. At the conclusion of each educational event, a certificate is usually obtained, either at the event or emailed afterward, sometimes with a fillable form certificate for the participant's name. At a minimum, each certificate should include: the certificant name, the topic name, the program sponsor, the course description (which should be sufficient to determine to appropriate domain), date(s) of attendance (which should fall within the 3 year reporting period), and number of CPE. This documentation should be saved in a form (i.e., filed by year and/or organization) which can be easily retrieved for uploading to ASIS when reporting to your personal portal when you log in to ASIS.

When you are ready to report your CPEs, log into your portal on the ASIS International website, go to 'Recertification' and indicate the type of activity from the drop-down menu (i.e., "education"), then sponsor (ASIS or any of the others listed i.e., "InfraGard"; if not listed, put "other" and then another line will appear and fill in the other provider/sponsor).



You're Finally Certified- Now What? Continued...

Then a drop down menu will appear asking what domain the topic covered (you may find it helpful to write in the domain on a copy of the certificate, scan that and save the notated copy to your files). Next give a description of the activity (e.g., “Current State of Cybersecurity”). Then you will be prompted to attach documentation of the event from your files; this is where you will select a copy of your Certificate which you will have previously scanned in or downloaded to your CPE file for the year being reported. Tedious? Yes, at first.

You will have to do this for EACH item you are reporting until you have reported the minimum 60 CPEs for the three year period in question. You also will have to attach documentation for each security or business-related organization you belong to with copies of receipts for paid memberships (if your ASIS dues are current you should see automatic credit for 4 CPEs / year for each of the 3 years). Read the guidelines carefully for types of documentation; for example, if you are a vendor who exhibited security products you may need to scan in a copy of your name badge from the event.

As your CPE status bar increases over the reporting period it will change color until it moves from amber to green when you’ve attained 60 CPEs. It is a good idea to have more than the minimum in case some items reported are ineligible. Keep your documents in order as you collect them and mark on the documents what is the topic / domain. This will make a tedious job much easier in the long run and the job of tracking your recertification will really be maintained by ASIS throughout your recertification period. If you hold more than one certification, you have to report 60 CPEs for every certification you hold. In some cases, one CPE activity may be submitted for more than one designation provided the course description of the activity aligns with that designation’s domains.

You can be proud of what you’ve accomplished and be mindful of your ongoing responsibilities so that you can continue to keep your credential current without the risk of losing it and having to repeat the process and expense. When you are ready to upload your recert credentials remember that there is a recertification fee to be paid (oh, yes) and then – and only then – will your package will be considered complete. ASIS requests 2 – 3 weeks before they can respond to you. If your activities include more than just attendance at educational events, such as volunteer, authorship, and instructor activities the Certification Guide will tell you what you need to provide. Remember that you cannot receive CPE credits for activities which are part of your regular job duties or company-specific training.
